Terms and Conditions

Award Amount

The scholarship award amount (if any) is determined by the Cessna 150-152 Fly-in Foundation d/b/a Cessna 150-152 Club, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation (the "Foundation"), in its sole discretion.

Selection

The Wayne Westerman Scholarship (the "Scholarship") is a highly competitive scholarship offered to a select number of individuals who are pursuing a private pilot certificate, advanced pilot certificate or rating, or an aircraft maintenance technician certificate issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Aviation Administration. The Foundation selects recipients based on timely submitted applications.

Eligibility

Recipients must be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident aged 16 or older, must use scholarship within two years of being offered the same, and may only receive the scholarship once. Recipients must be pursuing a private pilot certificate, an advanced pilot certificate or rating, or an aircraft maintenance technician certificate issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Aviation Administration at a 14 CFR Part 61 or 141 flight school or Part 147 aircraft maintenance school in the United States or United States Territories.

How this Scholarship is applied

This Scholarship is payable to the recipients' 14 CFR Part 61 or 141 flight school or Part 147 A&P school of choice, subject to such requirements as may be imposed by the Foundation in its sole discretion, and may be used to fund solely flight training course-related costs including tuition, aircraft rental/fuel costs, flight instruction fees, books or supplies/equipment (i.e. headsets, kneeboards, charts) for the pilot scholarship, or course-related costs including tuition, school fees, books or supplies/equipment for the maintenance technician scholarship; the Scholarship cannot be used to pay personal expenses. No portion of the Scholarship shall be refundable to the recipient if not used.

Withdrawal Policy

If a recipient withdraws from pursuing their private pilot certificate, the recipient forfeits any unused portion of the Scholarship, which (to the extent refundable) shall be refunded to the Foundation.

Photographic/Video and Information Release

Recipients of the Scholarship authorize the Foundation to take photographs, digital images, videos, digital videos and/or audio recordings of the recipient and to use and disclose the same, and their likeness, name, image and/or voice, for public relations purposes including in public media, such as newspapers, magazines, on the internet, and/or on television and in presentations, publications, brochures, advertisements, or articles.

Discrimination & Choice of Law

The Foundation does not discriminate based on a person's national origin, race, color, religion, disability, sex, familial status, or any other basis prohibited by applicable law. The Scholarship, all matters related to the Scholarship and these terms and conditions shall be governed by Illinois law, without regard to conflict of law principles.
